INTRODUCTION BROKEN PLACES IN A BROKEN WORLD

To live is to build.

ach of us is building something. We may be building a family, a career, a company, a ministry, a plan for retirement, a relationship. But each of us, consciously or not, is involved in building. We may have a crystal-clear blueprint, or we may just be going by some unspoken, vague, inner idea. But we are building—successfully or unsuccessfully—nonetheless.

In the midst of our building, it is inevitable that we are going to face the pain and disappointment of times and places of brokenness.

We live in a broken world. Each of us can easily point to so many things, in our individual lives, our families, our communities, our nations, our world, that are not "as they should be." These things cause us emotional or physical challenges, pain, frustration, or at times even trauma in some way.

Divorce, a lost or struggling relationship with a child, a bankruptcy in business, a conflict in a house of worship, an inner

There are those courageous ones who look at what is but see what could be. brokenness that no amount of prayer or time has been able to heal—there is no shortage of places where brokenness becomes evident.

The question for you and me is quite simple.

What are we going to do about it?

What are we going to do, if anything, about the Broken Places?

THE CHOICE OF A LIFETIME

Be clear. You DO have a choice. You can do nothing. You can accept the Broken Places as they are and leave them there. Some (many, in fact!) have decided that trying to repair the Broken Places is too risky, too costly, too dangerous, and the outcome too uncertain. Better to accept things as they are, this line of thinking goes, than to risk losing what little security you have.

But there are those courageous ones who look at what is but see what could be. They see themselves as part of a long line of dreamers and doers who throw themselves into places of breakdown and chaos and decide to become Builders and Repairers. They realize, with full clarity, that they may very well not succeed.

Except-they have redefined success.

Success is not the completion of the goal. Success, for them, is in getting up every day, no matter how tired, how cold, how alone...

and putting themselves to the task again. Success is in the effort. The commitment. The call. The cause.

A year after he left office, former U.S. President Theodore Roosevelt delivered a speech in Paris that was entitled "Citizenship in a Republic," often referred to also as "The Man in the Arena." In this well-known April 1910 address, he stated:

It is not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles, or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes short again and again, because there is no effort without error and shortcoming; but who does actually strive to do the deeds; who knows great enthusiasms, the great devotions; who spends himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who neither know victory nor defeat.¹

The good news is that history shows that Builders and Repairers have a great ally—the person of God Himself. Isaiah prophesied about the Builders. "Those from among you shall build the old waste places; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; and you shall be called the Repairer of the Breach, the Restorer of Streets to Dwell In" (Isaiah 58:12). "Those from among you shall build the old waste places; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; and you shall be called the Repairer of the Breach, the Restorer of Streets to Dwell In." —Isaiah 58:12 Our God is not afraid of brokenness. Not yours, and not mine. In fact, one could make the case that He actually gravitates towards impossible situations, heartaches, and pain. I like to think it allows Him to "show off" and display His God-ness.

He is the Healer of the brokenhearted (see Psalm 147:3), and in describing the

Presence of God that shines into the hearts of all who believe in Him, 2 Corinthians 4:7 says, "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of us."

Earthen vessels... so easily broken by those who would seek to trample on them. So often marred by the winds and floods of life that beat against the structure. So despairingly shattered by the unexpected tragedies that assail friend and foe alike in this life.

What are your Broken Places today?

I want to dare you to dream. To challenge you to believe. God wants to partner with you in healing your Broken Places, and then

in using your life and testimony to help heal Broken Places in our world.

GO TO YOURSELF

In Genesis 12:1, centuries before Nehemiah, God commanded Abram to leave everything that was comfortable to him and step out to make a new home for his family, which was to be in the land of Canaan. The name for the *parsha* (Torah Portion) that begins with this verse is *Lech Lecha*, which in Hebrew means "go to yourself." Before anything else, God's command to Abram was first a challenge to make changes in his life that would affect himself.

As we will see throughout Nehemiah's life story, true leadership only happens when the leader is willing to step forward and break through his or her own process, no matter how painful, before those whom that person is leading.

God is in the business of taking broken things and somehow using them for good. Unfortunately for us, this is much more easily said than experienced. We may never know the meaning, the "why," we had to experience certain things. God might never find it necessary to tell us. And what if He doesn't? What will our response be?

REPAIRING THE WORLD

There is a concept in Judaism that has become a plumb line, a word of direction for me in my life. It is known as *tikkun olam*—or the repairing of the world. Ever since the fall of man—and even

In other words, Nehemiah's story, which is epic and some might say has miraculous results, came about through simple but profound human obedience, passion, perseverance, courage, and hard work.

As we discover these life lessons together, I hope you will find with me what I have found to be true: that our brokenness does not disqualify us from being used by God. Rather, it can become the very thing that *qualifies* us. The rubble of our brokenness can produce the building blocks of our beautiful future, the open door towards the unfolding of a glorious destiny that is part of the vast story that God Himself is telling in the earth. Come with me as we delve into this remarkable biblical story together—the story of Nehemiah.
